

# Advisory: Lexington

## Overnight Bridge Demolition at Route 2A over I-95

*Periodic lane closures in place Sunday through Friday nights*

**LEXINGTON**– The Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) is announcing overnight demolition operations on I-95 (Route 128) at the Route 2A overpass in Lexington, beginning on Tuesday, January 2. Lane closures on I-95 will vary nightly to allow crews to safely demolish the northerly portion of the Route 2A bridge carrying traffic over I-95.

Certain operations will require all lanes on I-95 to be closed. The I-95 lane closures will begin at 8:30 p.m. and end at 5:00 a.m. Traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Route 2A off-ramp, cross over Route 2A, back down onto the highway utilizing the adjacent on-ramp.

Certain operations will require the closure of Route 2A at I-95. This closure will be implemented at 11:00 p.m. and be reopened at 5:00 a.m. Route 2A detour is as follows:

- Vehicles traveling westbound on Route 2A will detour northbound on I-95 to exit 49B (Route 4 northbound and Route 225 westbound) where they will be guided back down onto I-95 southbound back to Route 2A westbound.
- Vehicles traveling eastbound on Route 2A will be detoured onto I-95 southbound to exit 45A (Route 2 eastbound) where they will be guided back down onto I-95 northbound back to Route 2A eastbound.

The work is expected to take 4 weeks to complete. Police details and appropriate signage will be deployed to assist traffic flow around the work zones.

This work is part of a \$26.1 million project for the bridge replacement and related work (including signals and roundabout construction) of Route 2A (Marrett Road) over I-95. Work is expected to be completed in October 2027.

Appropriate signage, law enforcement details, and messaging will be in place to guide drivers during construction.
