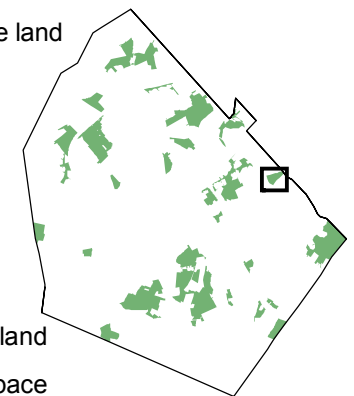
Shaker Glen

17 acres, 0.5 miles of trails. Shaker Glen offers a peaceful walk along a grassy corridor flanked by an oak-hickory forest between the paved sections of Rolfe Road. A branch from the path passes through the woods terminating near the Woburn line, and a small path meanders through a meadow. The many abandoned cultivated fruit trees growing on the property attract an abundance of wildlife.

Access is from each segment of Rolfe Road, from the dead end at the intersection of Fulton and Douglass Roads, and from the St. Paul's church parking lot, where parking for the use of Shaker Glen is allowed.
